- Decline in nonresident enrollment (predominately F1 students)
- Online course enrollment summer, fall, and winter
 - +492 FTES
 - +137 section
- Fewer students are enrolling from San Jose East of 880 (Alviso, Milpitas, Fremont, Union City, Newark, Hayward, East Palo Alto)
- Increasing student enrollment from "All Other Areas" is primarily attributed to online classes.
- Dual Enrollment High School +81 FTES Summer, Fall, Winter Most of the students are from our service area.

Annual Enrollment Picture

Non-Resident – trend was online classes

- 80% of the increase in the Non-Res Summer FTES was in Fine Arts = 16 FTES PSME = 16 FTES BSS = 18 FTES
- Main increase in Math specifically 7 FTES (Statistics = 3 FTES; Calculus 1A = 2 FTES)
- Commuter Science 6 FTES (CS 1A = 2; 21A 1 FTES; 3A = 1 FTES)
- Music 5 FTES all online classes
- Humanities = 5 FTES (6 different classes were offered in Humanities as compared to Summer 16 only offered the HUM 1 course)

Resident

- Increase in Fine Arts and Language Arts and BSS (+253 FTES)
- 66% of the FTES increase from Summer 2016 to Summer 2017
 - Accounting (+42), Humanities (+29), Philosophy (+28), Music (+28),
 - ART (+22), English (+21)

Overall

- Dual Enrollment +13 FTES Summer
- Online Enrollment +370 FTES Summer 94 more sections than the prior summer

Total = 20.3%

Fall 2017

Foothill was Down in Fall 2017

- Decline in F1/FZ headcount by 9% (1,004 to 911)
 - Decrease across almost all divisions higher decline in LA (-6 FTES) and SS (-4 FTES)


Foothill was Up in Fall 2017

- FTES online course enrollment increase (+71 FTES) from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017
 - more online offerings (+21 more sections)
- Dual Enrollment High School increase (+43FTES) from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017
- FTES increase among Latinx students (+26 FTES) in service area
 - Represents 34% of FTES Fall 2017 increase

Winter 2018 Enrollment Picture

Winter 2018

Foothill was **Down** in Winter 2018

Total = - 4.1%

Census = - 4.6%

- Down 11% in Face2Face FTES Down -203 FTES
- F1 student enrollment declined by 16% from Winter 2017 (1,061 to 887)
- FTES decline in PSME (primarily due to ASTR with -24 FTES)
- Decline in HIST (-10 FTES) and PSYC (-13 FTES)

Foothill was Up in Winter 2018

- Up 62% in Non-Credit Classes
- Dual Enrollment +25 FTES Winter
- Up 5% in
 - Online +51 FTES (+22 more sections)
 - Hybrid +20 FTES

- 111 (44%) were cancelled in January















How did you learn about GE Fridays


