Foothill recognizes the neighboring **Amah Mutsun Tribal** Band of Santa Cruz County, Confederated Villages of Lisjan, Indian Canyon, and other Ohlone tribal entities, families, and descendants. These communities continue to fight for the recognition of their sovereignty and to maintain traditional relationships with their land. We fully recognize, support, and advocate for the sovereign rights of all California's tribal communities and nations. We acknowledge and give our respect to the Indigenous peoples connected to and who have lived on this land past, present and future.
