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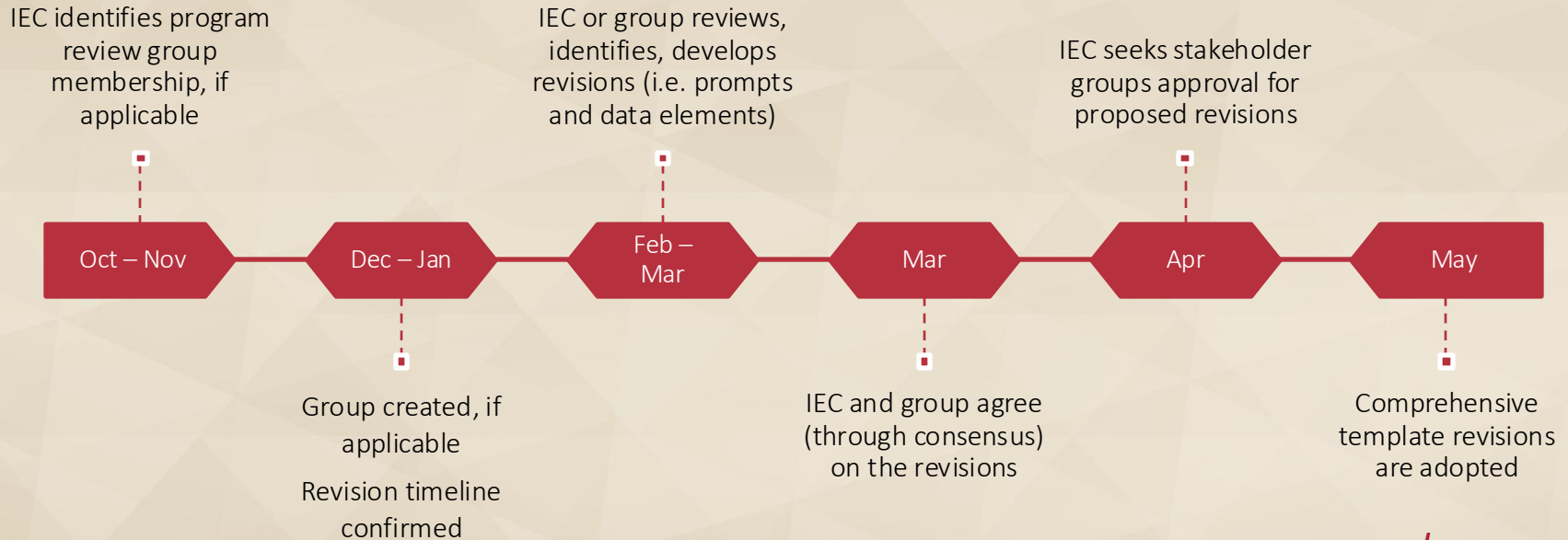

Program Review Revision Process

- Step 1: Foundation and Vision 
 - Establishing purpose
 - Taskforce structure
- Step 2: Alignment and Integration 
 - Connect to Blueprint 3.1 and Student Equity Plan
- Step 3: Template Development 
 - Revise and draft prompts
- Step 4: Validation and Refinement 
 - Constituency feedback
- Step 5: Implementation

Program Review Purpose: Emerging Themes

- Engaging with data can identify concrete opportunities
- Thoughtful engagement makes program review effective
- Templates should support reflection and actionable outcomes
- Process should be collaborative and meaningful
- Templates should integrate institutional priorities and related initiatives

Program Review Criteria

MEANINGFUL

Yields insights that matter to program improvement and student success

ENGAGING

Invites authentic participation and values expertise

REFLECTIVE

Prompts deep thinking about practice, not just reporting of data

ACTIONABLE

Leads to clear next steps with (identified) resources and responsible parties

ALIGNED

Connects program work to institutional goals and student equity commitments

Blueprint/Equity alignment

- Blueprint Goal 3: Strengthen and optimize resources for organizational effectiveness, operational efficiencies, and sustainability
 - Objective 3.1: Grow a culture of integrated planning, process efficiencies, and institutional effectiveness
- Student Equity Plan Core Elements
 - Goals/Metrics/Strategies for Student Populations Experiencing Disproportionate Impact (DI)
 - Emphasis on Transfer
- Unlocking Opportunity: Transfer and Workforce
 - Pathway to a baccalaureate and/or living wage

Review Process Structure Decision

IEC	Separate Group	Hybrid
Pros: • Maintains current structure • Fewer coordination challenges • Direct decision-making	Pros: • Focused attention on program review • Include broader representation	Pros: • Division of labor • IEC provides structure • Group does review and prompt development
Cons: • Limited perspectives • Time constraints w/other IEC agenda	Cons: • Requires some coordination • Additional time commitment for (some) IEC members	Cons: • Requires clear communication and organization
