College Promise Context: 18/19, R&R evaluated the Foothill College Promise Program and recommended some design changes (unlimited textbooks, eligibility for Financial Aid is no longer required, etc.); 19/20, marketing efforts and phone banks resulted in an increase of students for FHC Promise.	CP is very successful 440 students last year to 900 as of fall term Vast majority of students retained the full time status. Falling below 12 units precludes further participation. About 1% fall below and are forever excluded. Disabled students can seek a waiver. Significant factor of increase: targeted marketing, social media, mailers to increase awareness, enhanced program (unlimited textbooks, second year) 20-21 budget year proposal is to continue funding with a small
