### Japanese Cultural Center & Azumaya:

- Total Cost Estimate is \$567,495.
- Funding sources:
  - o Measure C: \$437,495
  - Donations: \$130,000
- Japanese Cultural Center has been used by Japanese program. Has exciting educational aspects.
- Donors are willing to put money into the renovations. But they want to see some matching on college side.
- JCC is about 40 years old. Don't know how much maintenance was done in the past.
   Roof needs to be replaced. If let it go, cost usually goes higher.

#### **Observatory:**

- Unique feature of Foothill campus.
- Right now, the observatory is used for by eye observing. Incredible engaging. The vision is to automate the facility. To set up a set of telescopes that can be used in an automated fashion every night. This could make much greater usage in our student education.
- Observatory Total cost estimate is approx. \$750,000.

- When to place locks in our classrooms? About 8 million for security from Measure

- We need to have a plan to decide prioritization. Need process.
- Fully support these two projects. But is this taking away from other things?
- We need a process for submission of proposed projects and a timeline for decisions and rankings.
- Don't know how long to put a list of projects with estimates. – We had the facility master plan list, and had the Measure G project list. But there is the donor aspect.
- We have a study group for FMP. We can talk about the process that we have already done.
- One of the criteria should also be # of people getting impacted. HVAC? -- HVAC system is already prioritized.
- Program review considerations can also be added.
- Foundation has had donors' money for 2 years. Need to show good faith of using that fund.
- Can we include if possible the donors/partnerships in evaluation/ranking process that Kathy mentioned?



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5	Carryover from B Budget	<ul> <li>Phuong shared the survey result on allocating money from the B budget carry-over funds for Equity and Enrollment.</li> <li>Received 110 responses from this survey.</li> <li>2/3 of them are in favor of allocating \$200k on equity work.</li> <li>Feedback received is: how we spent the allocation. Need clarification on the projects that we will be investing.</li> <li>Using carryover for hiring purposes? Need to decide what it's been used for.</li> <li>Equity initiative is a broad term. Need clarification.</li> <li>We decide the funding. Then leave equity team to decide.</li> <li>Prioritize what should be used for carryover and then decide the amount.</li> <li>Concern from faculty: This pot of money was identified on equity part and enrollment. Doesn't know what that means.</li> <li>Plan was meant to guide the work across the campus.</li> <li>Need to resolve the amount and year we allocate. Survey put 200k for 3 years. 3 or 5 years?</li> <li>Suggested doing 3 years and then assessing.</li> <li>Ok to use this money for ongoing positions?  - Typically, we don't use one-time money for ongoing positions. We can use ongoing fund source for ongoing positions. When we advertise the position, we need to put something like grant. - How to define equity initiatives. Can we use department budget to pay faculty for teaching?
- Equity and enrollment go hand in hand. Think about enrollment, also think about equity. Equity 2.0 is the place we can look at it and identify specific things.
- Equity office decide the list of priorities?
- Thuy: conceptional questions. Committed to use unspent savings in decades and use that for equity purposes. Examples could be: POCR would be the potential area to be spent, college-wide effort; equity coordinator; or pay for professional development. Would like to hear college community about the ideas.
- Who oversees the money and makes the decision? How to use B budget?
- Unique partners/programs (FEI, grant funded only, etc.) but doing equity also need support. Such as FEI. Moving forward, can we think about these programs.
- Unspent carryover fund. Lots of identified needs that have not been funded. Do we have a need to see budget development itself. Outcome based budgeting. Strategic objects into developing budget. How we prioritize funding each year. What process to consider.
- A lot of equity initiatives been identified in program review. How can we consider this.
