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Umoja Program Outcomes, 2016-17 RE:

Overview

This memo provides demographic, course success, persistence and English basic skills pathway completion rates for the 2016-17 Umoja cohort. Umoja students and courses¹ were verified with Umoja coordinators.

Summary (2016-17 Cohort = 59 students)

Demographics

The majority of Umoja students are 20 to 24 years old (58%), male (76%), African American (49%) or Latinx (25%), have a high school diploma or equivalent (92%) and would like to transfer to a four-year institution (85%). Nearly half of the 2016-17 cohort (46%) reported their household income is \$24,999 or fewer, and a little over one-third are first-generation college² (34%) and student athletes (36%).

Course Success

- The overall Umoja course success rate was 72%.
- Umoja males had a higher course success rate than compared to females, 73% vs. 70%.
- Umoja African American and Latinx have course success rates of 75% and 70%, respectively.

Persistence

- Of the 59 Umoja students, 53 started in Umoja in the fall term. The persistence rate of Umoja students enrolled in any Umoja section from fall to winter term was 68%, and from winter to spring was 78%. Of those who started in the fall, a little over half (53%) were retained to spring.
- English Basic Skills Pathway Completions (ENGL 209-110-1A and ENGL 110-1A)
 - Of the 59 Umoja students, 7 started in transfer-level English, and 4 students started in basic skills but completed ENGL 1A prior to joining Umoja.
 - Of the remaining 48 Umoja students:
 - 41 enrolled in an Umoja ENGL 209 or ENGL 110 section, and 21 completed ENGL 1A in an Umoja section (51%). Refer to page 6 for details on who completed.
 - 7 students did not enroll in ENGL 209 or ENGL 110, but rather enrolled in an Umoja ENGL 12, COMM 4 and/or PSYC 22 section(s), and 6 completed ENGL 1A but their completion was not in an Umoja section (86%).

¹ Umoja courses typically includes a "U" in the course sequence number. For a list of Umoja courses, see Appendix.

² First-generation college students are those whose parents'/guardians' highest educational attainment is high school or less.

Demographics

The fall term was used to capture Umoja student's demographic information.

 Age & Gender: The 2016-17 cohort consisted of students aged 20 to 24 (58%), followed by 19 or less (34%). The majority of the cohort are male (76%).

• Ethnicity: Nearly half of the 2016-17 cohort are African American (49%), followed by Latinx (25%). Combined, disproportionately impacted groups, consisting of African American, Filipinx, and Latinx, accounted for 81% of the cohort.

Course Success

The data in this section reflects the course outcomes of Umoja students in Umoja sections. Umoja sections include core and optional Umoja sections (see Appendix for list of courses), but omits NCBS 405 as it is non-credit. Non-Umoja students were omitted.

Overall Course Success: The 2016-17 course success rate in all Umoja sections was 72%.

• Course Success by Ethnicity: In 2016-17, Umoja African American and Latinx students had a course success rate of 75% and 70%, respectively. Pacific Islander comprised the third largest enrollment group, accounting for about 12% of all Umoja course enrollments. Less than half of Pacific Islander students (48%) received passing grades in Umoja sections. Combined, disproportionately impacted groups have a success rate of 76%.

• Course Success by First-Generation College: In 2016-17, the course success rate of Umoja firstgeneration college students was 67%, a difference of 8 percentage points when compared to their non-first generation counterpart.

Persistence

- Table 14 provides the persistence rate of Umoja students who started in any Umoja section during the fall term. These students were tracked to see how many persisted to winter and then to spring in Umoja sections.
 - 53 of the 59 Umoja students enrolled in an Umoja section in the fall term.
 - 36 (68%) persisted to an Umoja section in the winter term.
 - 28 (78%) persisted to an Umoja section in the spring term.
 - Of those who started in the fall, a little over half (53%) were retained to spring.
 - 6 students started in an Umoja section in the winter term; and while all of them persisted to spring, only 1 of the 6 students persisted to spring in an Umoja section.

English Basic Skills Pathway Completions

The 2016-17 cohort had two English pathways: ENGL 209-110-1A and ENGL 110-1A.

Overview of Umoja English Basic Skills Students & Who was Included in Pathway Analysis

Of the 59 students in the cohort, 52 are English basic skills students. There were 7 students who never enrolled in ENGL 209/110/1S, and instead enrolled in transfer-level English courses.

- Students omitted from the analysis (N=4)
 - 4 of the 52 students enrolled had already completed ENGL 1A prior to joining the 2016-17 Umoja cohort. These 4 students enrolled in Umoja sections ENGL 12, COMM 4 and/or PSYC 22 during 2016-17.
- Students included in the analysis (N=48)
 - Umoja English Pathway
 - 41 students are enrolled in an Umoja ENGL 209 or ENGL 110 section.
 - Not Umoja English Pathway
 - 2 students enrolled in Umoja COMM 4 and no other Umoja sections. They had enrolled in ENGL 209 or ENGL 110 prior to joining the 2016-17 Umoja cohort.

5 students enrolled in Umoja ENGL 12, COMM 4 and/or PSYC 22. They had enrolled in ENGL 209 or ENGL 110 prior to joining the 2016-17 Umoja cohort.

Umoja English Pathway Completers (table 15)

- 21 of 41 Umoja students (51%) completed the English basic skills pathway.
 - Males comprise 80% of those who started in basic skills English, and less than half (48%) completed the pathway. In comparison, females had a higher pathway completion rate (63%).
 - African Americans account for 46% of those who started in basic skills English and less than half, 9 of 19 (47%) completed the pathway.
 - 6 of 11 (55%) Latinx completed the pathway.

Not Umoja English Pathway Completers (table 16)

- 6 of 7 Umoja students (86%) completed ENGL 1A. As reminder, these students are English basic skills students who did not enroll in an Umoja ENGL 209 or ENGL 110 section. Additionally, their completion of ENGL 1A was not in an Umoja section.
 - Across the demographic categories, more than half of the students completed ENGL 1A. The exception is first-generation college students with a completion rate of 50%.
