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RE: 2017-18 Four-Year Transfer numbers

Overview

The 2017-18 transfer data, identified from the California State University Chancellor's Office, University of California Office of the President, and California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, are analyzed to present a report about the transfer rate and patterns to the CSU and UC systems as well as the in-state privates and out-of-state institutions.

Highlights:

- The transfer rate to the in-state public system, CSUs and UCs, increased by 9% between 2016-17 and 2017-18 (CSU: +28%; UC: -6%).
- The transfer rate in-state privates and out-of-state institutions changed between 2016-17 and 2017-18 (ISP: -9%; OoS: +7%).
- The largest number of CSU transfers enrolled at San Jose State University (274), San Francisco State University (81) and Cal State East Bay (55).
- Asian¹ students represent over one-fourth of those enrolling in the CSU system in 2017-18 (26%), while Latinx and White students represent 47% of all CSU transfer students (26% Latinx; 21% White).
- The acceptance rate to the UC system in 2017-18 is 78%.
- The mean GPA in 2017-18 among those accepted to and enrolling in the UC system is 3.44 and 3.47 respectively.
- The largest number of UC transfers in 2017-18 enrolled at UC Davis (113), UC San Diego (84), and UC Berkeley (69). All three institutions experienced a decrease in Foothill transfers.
- San Jose State University experienced the largest percentage rate increase (63%) in the number of transfer students between 2016-17 and 2017-18 (168 to 274 students).
- Compared to neighboring community colleges, Foothill had the 4th highest number of transfer students to the CSUs (after De Anza, Evergreen, and Skyline) and the 2nd highest transfers to the UC system (after De Anza).

California Public Four-Year Transfers

In the past academic year, 508 Foothill students transferred to a CSU while 486 transferred to an UC institution. While total transfers increased from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017, UC transfers numbers decreased and CSU transfers increased. This trend represents a 9% increase in the number of fallto-fall transfer students (Table 1). Transfers to the CSU system exceeded those transferring to the UCs for the first time over the past five years.

California State University

Out of the 508 students transferring to a CSU institution, the largest representation was at San Jose State University (274), followed by San Francisco State (81) and Cal State East Bay (55). Cal State Sacramento (17) and Cal State Long Beach (10) represent the remaining top five CSU transfer destinations among Foothill students (Table 2). Compared to 2016-17, the number of transfer students to these five institutions increased from 316 students to 437 (38%). This increase is accounted for by the numbers of transfer students enrolling at San Jose State University (+106), Cal State San Francisco (+11), and Cal State East Bay (+7). Increased student transfers also occurred at Cal State Fullerton (+2), Cal State Humboldt (+2), Cal State Northridge (+3), Cal State San Diego (+3), and Cal State Stanislaus (+3).

Compared to 2016-17, Foothill generally transferred a higher number of students from all ethnicities. Latinx students represent the largest percentage among transferring students (26%), with Asian (including Filipinx) students at (22%) and White students at (21%).

University of California

In 2017-18, there were 834 Foothill College applicants to the University of California system, with 647 applicants being admitted, yielding a final enrollment of 488 (Table 4). There was a 78% acceptance rate with just over three-quarters of those admits enrolling at an UC campus. The number of applications decreased from Fall 2016 by 6% (887 to 834), while the percentage of admits increased by 2% (Fall 2016: 676 out of 887 or 76% vs. Fall 2017: 647 out of 834 or 78%).

Table 5 shows the UC institutions where Foothill students transferred over the past five years. In 2017-18, UC Davis enrolled the greatest number (113), representing 23% of Foothill students transferring to the UC system. Along with UC San Diego (84), UC Berkeley (69), and UCLA (53), these four campuses represent the top UC transfer destinations.

Table 6 shows that students transferring to the UC institutions are more likely to be International and Asian, with International (F1) students composing 34% among transfers in 2017-18. African American students continue to represent less than 10% of UC transfers.

Comparisons with Other Community Colleges

Below are the 2017-18 California State University and University of California transfer numbers from Foothill College along with some of the neighboring colleges. Compared to some these other institutions, Foothill transferred a greater numbers of students to both the CSU and to the UC system (Tables 7 and 8).

Among the CSU transfer students, Foothill's neighboring institutions sent the majority of their students to San Jose State University, San Francisco State University, and Cal State East Bay (similar to Foothill). Due to proximity and its feeder school relationship, almost two-thirds of the CSU transfers from Skyline College enrolled in San Francisco State University (67%). San Jose City College, Evergreen College, Mission College, and West Valley College also had a majority of its CSU transfer students attending San Jose State University (72%, 70%, 61%, and 59% respectively). Note that De Anza College, Evergreen College, and Skyline College transferred more students to the CSU system compared to Foothill College.

Within the UC system, UC Davis, UC Berkeley, and UC San Diego represent the top transfer destinations among these local community colleges. Foothill transfers are following this trend (Table 8).

Table 9 provides information regarding students who transferred to in-state privates and outof-state colleges and universities. There appears to be a decreasing trend in attendance at instate privates over the past few years, and an increase in transfers to out-of-state institutions over the previous year.
