




Year-to-Year Enrollment Decline




Key observation: FTES decline from NR and Summer; role of F1 enr






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







Does modality facilitate course success (Fall-to-Fall)?







Latinx gap persists at -6%; Black gap narrowed by 5%; Overall success rate=81%



Asynchronous learning yielded lower success rates







