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RE: Course Success Rates by Instructional Modality and Ethnicity, 2018-19 to 2020-21

## Overview

In 2020-21, Foothill College intentionally scheduled the majority of its classes in a virtual format. Due to the pandemic, the campus began to shelter-in-place beginning early March 2020 and continued to offer most instruction and services in a online format through Summer 2021.

An examination of the three-year course success rates by instructional modality and ethnicity explores the more direct outcomes of the virtual transition. The three-year time frame was identified to capture a full year prior to the pandemic along with a full year under pandemic guidelines.

To focus the analysis, key courses with consistent enrollment from 2018-19 to 2020-21 were identified by the instructional deans. In 2018-19 and 2019-20, these courses were offered in multiple instructional modalities, but in 2020-21 only online sections were scheduled. These courses include: ACTG 1A, ANTH 1, BIOL 40A, BUSI 22, BUSI 59, CHEM 30A, COMM 1A, ECON 1A, ECON 1B, ENGL 1A, ENGL 1B, GEOG 1, MATH 1A, MATH 10, POLI 1, PSYC 1, SOC 1. Appendix A provides a detailed view of online course success rates at the course level across all three years.

## **Highlights**

- Overall course success rates increased by 2-percentage points from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Face-to-Face (F2F)/hybrid course success rates were slightly higher when compared to online success rates (+1-percentage point).
- An increase in online success rates was experienced by all ethnicities from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- The course success gap between the highest performing group and lowest performing group students is as large as 20-percentage points.
- BIOL 40A and CHEM 30A experienced higher success rates when these sections were only offered online in 2020-21.
- ENGL 1A/1B completion rates were generally higher when offered through a F2F/hybrid modality.
- MATH 10 online success rates were slightly higher compared to F2F/hybrid sections.
- BUSI 22, ECON 1B, POLI 1 demonstrated higher success rates in F2F/hybrid sections.

Table 1 shows that while the enrollment declined in the 17 identified courses by roughly 1%, the course success rates increased by 2-percentage points from 70% in 2018-19 to 72% in 2020-21 (when all courses were online only).



Even after excluding the Spring 2020 grades (due to inconsistencies with the instructional modality coding), the 2-percentage point increase in course success rates remain stable during the same three-year time frame (Chart 1).

Table 2 shows the enrollment or number of final grades associated with the 17 courses without Spring 2020. The total column reflects 4,327 grades that are not included. There appears to be slight increase in the nonsuccess rates when excluding Spring 2020 (+2-percentage points).

An examination of course success rates by instructional modality shows that face-to-face (F2F)/hybrid instruction yields slightly higher passing grades compared to online courses, except for 2020-21 (Table 3). There is no exact comparison data by instructional modality for 2020-21 as all 17 courses were offered online only.

Table 4 shows that the F2F/hybrid course success rates are slightly higher or comparable to online pass rates when disaggregated by ethnicity. African American/Black students experience a 5-percentage point difference between their completion rates in F2F/hybrid and online sections. Asian and White students continue to have the highest success rates by ethnicity regardless of instructional modality. The success gap between the highest performing and lowest performing ethnicities is as large as 20-percentage points.



In 2020-21, the success rates in online sections increased noticeably among all ethnicities compared to previous years (Chart 2). Among African American/Black and Filipinx students, the online success increased by 8% while Latinx student rates increased by 4%. Asian and White students also increased their online course success rates by 2% and 4% respectively. Despite these increases, there is a range between the actual online course success rates by ethnicity, from the highest performing group in 2020-21 at 82% (Asians) to the lowest performing group at 54% (Pacific Islanders). It is noted that the more dramatic increases and decreases in online success rates seen with Native American and Pacific Islander may be less meaningful given the smaller size of these two student populations (Table 5).

As noted in Chart 2, there continues to be an equity gap in online course success rates by ethnicity. These gaps are visible even as online success rates increased over time, demonstrating the challenge with "a rising tide raises all boats" approach to improving online completion. The success gap narrowed between African Americans/Blacks and Asians from -26% in 2018-19 to -20% in 2020-21. Latinx students also narrowed the online success gap from -22% to -20% in these three years. There should be caution applied when interpreting the relationship of the 2019-20 online success rates with other years given that the 2019-20 figures do not include Spring 2020.

While additional statistical calculation indicates that the increase in African American/Black and Latinx online success rates are statistically significant at p<0.05, suggesting that this increase is not occurring simply by chance, it is important to note that some of this effect may be mediated by other factors, including self-selection and forced enrollment into the online instructional modality. Students without adequate resources may have exited and left the college (or never enrolled). Given the college's pivot online in Spring 2020, student success and support services were also more robust in the virtual space compared to previous years. Instructor variability, comfort, and skill with online teaching methodologies may also play a role in facilitate online course success.

Table 6 examines the success rates by instructional modality for the 17 courses identified at the beginning of this report. In BIOL 40A and CHEM 30A, the online success rate in 2020-21 was higher than the two previous years when both courses were only offered in a F2F/hybrid

format. In ENGL 1A/1B the online course success rates were generally lower than the F2F/hybrid completion rates. Meanwhile, MATH 1A/10 demonstrated comparable course success rates by modality. BSS courses generally had higher online success rates in 2020-21 except in BUSI 22/59, ECON 1A/1B, and POLI 1. Table cells shaded in grey highlight the courses, instructional modality, and year that have lower than two-thirds completion rates. Lower success rates from 2019-20 are not highlighted due to the exclusion of the Spring 2020 data.

## Methodology

These data in this report are based on end-of-term grades where course success is defined by an A, B, C, P grade. Nonsuccess and withdraw categories include D, F, I, NP, RD, EW, FW, IW, W. Consequently, only credit courses are included. The analysis focuses on the primary terms in the academic year, so fall, winter, spring quarters only. Second Spring and Summer terms are excluded. With the exception of Table 1, Spring 2021 is also excluded from 2020-21 data because the section coding was not revised to reflect the pivot to virtual instruction that occurred for that term. As a result, it becomes difficult to analyze Spring 2021 section data by instructional modality. Instructional modality are grouped into two main categories: Face-to-Face (F2F)/Hybrid and Online. Online sections are identified by classes ending in V, W, Z while Hybrid includes sections ending with R, T, Y. All other sections are taught face-to-face. Dual enrollment sections are included. Due to the small counts, Decline to State students are excluded from this report.
