
Student Education Level

Access to Transfer-Level Courses

- Open enrollment into transfer-level English and Math
- Increased access → increased number of students passing transfer-level Math and English




Completion Outcomes

- Students who complete **career and technical education** coursework w/o transferring experience a 55% median change in earnings.
- In 2024-25: 971 AA, AS, and ADT degrees awarded; 1,321 certificates of achievement awarded; **50 BS** degrees awarded (Dental Hygiene)
