Governance Updates

Advisory Council Report:

The Advisory Council (AC) met on Jan. 24. As always, the AC had a packed agenda. The group agreed on a feedback loop for the program/certificate approval process and was adamant that governance should not slow down the process. AC members stressed that the feedback could be asynchronous to facilitate quick responses and that a simple guide (not a rubric) might help governance groups know what to look for in each proposal.

The AC also looked at the New Faculty Prioritization for 2020. AVPI **Paul Starer** talked the AC through the prioritization process and AS President, **Isaac Escoto**, updated the group on the Senate's discussions. After an involved discussion, the AC voted unanimously to approve the prioritization rankings with the caveat that the college should explore additional funding sources to expand the number of hires made this year. Finally, the AC voted to approve an extension for the Equity 2.0 plan to be due on June 30 and to move the EMP 2030 discussion to 2020-21.

The California LAW board formally voted last Friday to accept Foothill College into the law pathway program as an innovation incubator.




Stanford EPIC Fellowship
