

#### Governance

#### **Advisory Council**

Advisory Council met on Friday, May 28, for the second to last meeting of the year. Topics discussed included a hiring update about the open tenure-track, full-time faculty and admin positions in Instruction & Student Services. The Council then debriefed the two days of Program Review presentations, offering their appreciation for the wonderful "town-hall" style forum which gave much more campus exposure to the excellent presentations by the authors of the program



reviews. The Council will propose in its transition plan to 2021-22 work a "revival" of an IP&B-like study group or committee, that will continue to refine the program review process and templates.

The Council also received an update on the Accreditation Midterm Report, which they are asked to review in advance of the final meeting on June 4. The largest

amount of meeting time was dedicated to a discussion of the Shared Governance Task Force proposal, which culminated in a unanimous approval of the proposal, and an agreement to dedicate most of the June 4 meeting to an All-Council review of the RP Group Final Report on Governance, which will be facilitated by Dr. Darla Cooper of the RP Group, and an opportunity for the College to share their reactions, questions, and suggestions for improvements to shared governance at Foothill.

Last but definitely not least, VP Bret Watson shared the exciting California Governor's May Revise of the State's Budget, which paints a very optimistic panorama of the 2021-22 budget for funding for California Community Colleges. One caution Bret shared with the Council was that much of this funding appears to be one-time dollars, which can create some challenges due to hiring issues with one-time dollars. That said, much optimism was felt by all upon hearing this news.

# **Academic Senate Adopts Resolution on Supporting the Mental Health of Black Students**



On May 24, Academic Senate approved the following resolution on supporting the mental health of Black students.

Whereas, the murder of George Floyd and continued policeinvolved killings of Black lives has reopened a psychological wound for Black students and revealed unique challenges within mental health services;

Whereas, the experience of racism – both direct and indirect in the form of microaggressions or exposure to racism through

course content – can have a devastating effect on the mental health of Black students;

Whereas, predetermined consequences such as expulsions, suspensions, and referrals to law enforcement for specific offenses disproportionately affect Black students and often can lead to depression, anxiety or addiction as a result of zero-tolerance discipline policies:

Whereas, the October 2020 Open Letter to Foothill College Governance drafted by Foothill students and subsequently approved by the Associated Students of Foothill College (ASFC), provides a full scope of what students would like to see going forward to address the ongoing violence and systemic racism against the Black community, including a commitment to providing faculty with the professional development needed to lead with compassion and implement inclusive teaching practices;

Whereas Foothill College's Strategic Vision for Equity 2021-2025 has identified goals to address the mental health needs of students of color, including investigating and employing creative solutions on how to expand racial trauma-informed psychological services for students, and ensuring students of color have broad access to diverse mental health professionals, especially around trauma related to police interactions: therefore be it

**Resolved**, the Foothill College Academic Senate commits itself to the psychological well-being of Black students by recognizing that a trauma-informed practice recognizing signs, symptoms, and risks will better support the mental health needs of our Black students, and, be it further

**Resolved**, the Foothill College Academic Senate creates conditions that strengthen anti-racism awareness by promoting on-going professional development for faculty in unconscious bias, racial trauma, and racial diversity, and, be it further

**Resolved**, that the Foothill Academic Senate work with administration and student groups to develop a responsible student conduct and disciplinary framework centered on restorative justice principles based on Inclusive Decision-making, Active Accountability, Repairing Harm, and Rebuilding Trust.

# **Provide Feedback on the Draft Midterm Report**

As part of the regular seven-year accreditation cycle, Foothill College is due to submit its Midterm Report to ACCJC in October 2021. We began this process in fall 2020 after Advisory Council convened a Midterm Study Group composed of classified staff, faculty, and administrators. The Accreditation Steering Committee, which includes representatives from Academic Senate, Classified Senate, President's Office,



and Office of Instruction, has compiled the study group's work into one document.

You are invited to provide feedback on the draft Midterm Report. Feedback will be collected on the webpage where the midterm report is posted. No experience with accreditation is necessary—this is an open process that welcomes everyone.

#### **Read the Midterm Report DRAFT**

The **deadline** to submit feedback is **Wednesday**, **June 16**.

Final edits to the Midterm Report will conclude by the end of June. The Midterm Report will be submitted for Board approval at their August meeting.
