While we would all love to return to campus, the current spike in COVID-19 infections and the fact that we do not yet have a reliable timeline for a vaccine program makes it very difficult to imagine any larger-scale return before July 2021. This announcement provides clarity so our students, faculty, and staff can now plan accordingly.


In addition, the Foothill-De Anza District decided to opt out of spring 2021 athletic competition. This was a very difficult decision, but was taken with the health and safety of our students and staff firmly in mind. There is a possibility that we could start conditioning classes in the spring and the district will assess this possibility in the winter quarter. Thank you to everyone who has been engaged in conversations around the return to campus. None of us has been in this situation before, but if we continue to move forward with kindness and understanding we can overcome any obstacle.

Governance Update

Revenue & Resources Council

At its Nov. 6 meeting, the R&R Council had the return to campus discussion, which would be continued in future meetings. Facilities Master Plan and bond priorities list updates were provided. Apprenticeship certificates of achievement programs were



presented and supported by the Council. The Council also approved the proposal to transition the Foothill College bookstore to the "contract management" model of operation by Summer 2021 as long as staffing can be negotiated satisfactorily. The council also approved two requests from Admin Council for return to campus, which would have allowed Athletics to start conditioning in January 2021 and could allow KCI to maintain the equipment in the Makerspace as early as November or December.



This fall, the college launched a free Contact Tracing and Case Investigation course to help meet the demand for trained contact tracers during the COVID-19
