

Obituary for Dr. Konnilyn Feig

Dr. Konnilyn G. Feig of Corte Madera, California, 84, passed away after a short stay in the hospital on Sunday morning, March 21, 2021. She leaves behind thousands of books of every genre, copious research files and notes, heartbroken friends, family, colleagues, and dogs, a lifetime of students she fired with endless intellectual ambition and community service, and an extraordinary legacy.

Words used by her friends and colleagues to describe this remarkable woman are "gifted professor and teacher of substance and compassion," "student mentor," "author," "accomplished, consequential global scholar and



ambassador," "trailblazing educational and social justice leader," and "force of nature." Konnilyn Feig's journey through life was filled with triumphs despite early challenges.

STEM Equity Seminars for Owls




