

- To create a meaningful, safe, and brave place to discuss race.






### 1. Do you work directly in a Student Services Department or Program?




## 3. How much do you agree with each of the following statements?




#### 5. How effective were each of the following conference activities?




#### 2. Which of the following best describes your race/ethnicity?

- I feel appreciated by Dr. Scolari and Student Services leadership and this was definitely communicated throughout the conference, but not by the larger campus community as a whole outside of this event, particularly tenured faculty in instruction. I wish some of them could have attended this conference.
- I think it would be helpful to have a conference more frequently than once a year. Perhaps on a quarterly basis.
- I think that we should focus on other topics besides Black Lives Matter if we are going to spend a whole day in a Student Services
  Conference. We have had a lot of training on that this year already. I feel that brown students are being excluded from the
  discussions.
- I think the conference was fantastic and incredibly well done, with top quality speakers and topics. My only complaint is the length, as being in Zoom from 9 a.m. to 4:30 is exhausting and I don't think we are understanding the negative impact that Zoom has on our mental health. We need to reduce the length of Zoom meetings.
