4. Workforce Development Curriculum	Speaker: John Mummert, Reg Duhe <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mummert introduced Reg Duhe, Director of Business and Educational Partnerships. His responsibilities are Contract Education, internship programs and apprenticeship programs. • Mummert reminded CCC of the three categories of offerings: 1-credit 2- noncredit and 3-not for credit. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ They are currently exploring the "Not for credit" course possibilities. ◦ These courses are different than credit/noncredit: they do not require instructors to meet min. quals, we don't receive apportionment for them, but they give faculty opportunity to offer instruction that they might later move to a credit offering. • Holcroft asked if there is any communication mechanism to inform campus community about offerings or possible opportunities. This body would like to suggest that they have a dynamic web page that keeps us up to date on the various projects. Lots of opportunities to collaborate/support not for credit efforts that are currently lost b/c faculty unaware of not for credit. Mummert commented that this is good idea, cautioned that there's often competition from other schools so do not usually publicize efforts widely. • Duhe working with BSS faculty to implement new variable unit course, (1 to 5 units), that is a true internship for students. They must be able to establish an internship directly related to their major. This may be associated with companies or at other colleges. Any faculty that's interested in using an internship should contact Duhe. • Foothill has opportunity to join a nationwide consortium, Global Corporate College, where we could deliver instruction for corporations. If our courses taught in multiple areas, we can get paid basically royalties.

Please distribute to your constituency groups.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bill would require CCC/CSU/UC to develop online offerings to be placed in a “California Virtual Campus.”• We (Foothill/CCCs) would be required to give local college credit to students who successfully completed courses via CA Virtual Campus and passed an exam.• Holcroft reminded that students can currently earn Credit by Exam for selected courses at Foothill, but that the exams are developed and administered by Foothill faculty. This bill would allow students to earn Foothill credit for passing exams developed and administered elsewhere.

Basic color-mixing and paint handling exercises using different paint media to execute charts, expand the palette of historical, and modern colors including their cultural uses. Students experience the difference in handling between student grade, professional grades and the variables among the many manufactured colors and gain a basic understanding of and competency in mixing skills, both visual and manual. Theory of Color is studied in Art 20A and 20B, but there is little time to explore the enormous variety of colors available both through mixing or those available for purchase.

Focus on apps aligned with the California Common State Standards for Math and English Language Arts. Create lessons and instructional materials for student use on the iPad. Proposed Title: Music in Film

Proposed Catalog Description:

A study of how music propels the story line in motion pictures from symphonic scores to pop soundtracks comparing imagery, camera angles, emotions, characterizations, rhythm, intervals, melody, chords, and orchestration. An analysis of musical techniques from the earliest examples of film sound to film noir, westerns to James Bond, Hitchcock to musicals, and the Golden Era of Hollywood to Star Wars. Students will differentiate between parallel (example-Psycho shower scene), contrapuntal (example-Godfather christening scene) and associative (example-Titanic instrument choices that establish a specific period) types of music in film. The goal of the class is to identify how music and culture function to highlight dialogue, reflect thoughts, create tension, connect scenes, and establish a sense of place. Previous musical knowledge is helpful, but not necessary.

DISCIPLINE STATUS REPORT:

Spring CTE Disciplines Convened: Faculty from Addiction Studies, Allied Health, Automotive Technology, Commercial Music, Culinary Arts and Emergency Medical Services attended two Discipline Input Group (DIG) meetings held in May. The attendees initiated work on descriptors, non-transfer degrees and certificates for those disciplines. Faculty will not be convened until the fall to prepare drafts for vetting.

Model Curriculum: The Spring CTE disciplines focused on the development of C-ID descriptors and model curricula. These CTE disciplines were not selected for convening due to their transfer volume, but due to the volume of certificates and degrees awarded. The faculty were asked if C-ID descriptors and/or model curricula would be of benefit to students in their disciplines. Many disciplines began development of descriptors and model curricula. The generic term "model curriculum" (MC) is also being used for transfer disciplines that are developing MCs (as opposed to TMCs) in disciplines that do not "fit" into the SB 1440 60 + 60 structure. Please see below for updates on the MCs being developed by nursing and engineering.

Agriculture

The TMCs continue vetting until June 30th. Please encourage your faculty to provide feedback.

Art History

The [web](#) version of ARTH 145 (Art of the Ancient Americas) was corrected to reflect the appropriate prerequisite and advisory courses that were inadvertently reversed. The Word version of the descriptor contained the appropriate prerequisite (none) and advisory (Completion of or concurrent enrollment in English Composition C-ID ENGL 100) language. In addition, C-ID ENGL 100 was appropriately inserted in place of English 1A on the ARTH 110 and 120 descriptor advisories.

Biology

Revised and new Biology descriptors, as well as the TMC, will be posted for vetting in the fall.

Chemistry

The Chemistry FDRG will confer regarding the three Chemistry descriptors that have closed vetting. Any descriptors that require additional vetting will be posted in the fall.

Economics

Vetting continues for the Economics TMC until June 15th. Please encourage faculty to provide feedback.

Engineering

The Intersegmental Curriculum Workgroup (ICW) has accepted the Model Curricula proposed for this discipline. Discussion is underway regarding any potential SB 1440 benefits for Model Curriculum-aligned degrees.

English

The English TMC was updated to reflect the re-addition of a sequence of "Survey of Literature in English" courses under the options for List A

English (continued)

Literature in English is a sequence that combines English and American literature, as well as literature from other English-speaking countries, over a three-course, 12-unit series (each C-ID course descriptor is 4 units). These courses were included in the originally approved English TMC, but because they are less common in the CSU system than in the UC system, they were temporarily removed while the need for them was investigated. Now that a need has been determined, they have been added back to their original place on the TMC and the descriptors for them have been posted. The narrative that accompanies the English TMC has been updated to reflect this change

Information Systems

TMCs and descriptors continue vetting until June 15th. Please encourage your faculty to leave feedback.

Kinesiology

The Kinesiology FDRG has been discussing the most appropriate approach for the activity/movement courses. We hope to have this issue reconciled in the near future.

Mathematics

Math 955 (Precalculus & Trigonometry) nears finalization by the FDRG.

Nursing

The Nursing FDRG met at the end of May. The Model Curriculum was refined and will post again for vetting in the fall to ensure statewide input.

Film, Television and Electronic Media

(Formerly Radio/TV/Film)

The ICW accepted the TMC and it will soon be posted in final form, along with descriptors, on the C-ID website.

C-ID FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Does a Course Outline of Record (COR) expire once approved for C-ID?

CORs that achieve C-ID designation (approval) do not expire. CORs must be resubmitted when a significant local change (course content; course objectives/SLOs; Prerequisites(s); Corequisite(s); a unit change to less than the descriptor unit minimum) is made or if the C-ID descriptor is reviewed by the FDRG at the five-year cycle and is found to require significant changes. Colleges will be given sufficient time to resubmit their courses if needed. Expiration dates apply only to resubmission periods (conditional or not approved courses) and to TCSU approved courses.

2. How do I submit variable unit CORs to C-ID?

If your COR has variable units, and the lowest unit amount is less than the descriptor requires, your course will not be approved. If the lowest variable unit amount meets the minimum descriptor units then you may submit your course to C-ID by entering the minimum unit amount.

3. Why do some approved courses not appear on the Courses page of the C-ID website?

C-ID approved courses which have effective dates in the future will not appear on the Courses page of the C-ID website until the effective date has been reached. Approved submissions which contain more than one COR (for example a sequence course like Math 900S or potentially a lecture/lab combination like Geog 115), will not appear on the Courses page of the C-ID website until the effective date for all CORs has been reached.
