REMINDERS:

- ❖ **Transfer Degree Status:** The State Chancellor informed us in Nov 2012 that if we offer a local degree in any of the State-approved Transfer Model Curricula, we must develop and receive State approval for an Associate's Degree for Transfer no later than Fall 2014. There are currently 24 TMCs. We do not offer local degrees in 5 of these, already have approval for two (Psychology & Sociology), and have three applications in submission with the State. This leaves 14 remaining as "in progress" and it is imperative that discipline faculty in these areas work diligently to develop them - the deadline will sneak up quickly! We still have a considerable amount of work to do but we are well on our way.
