- ❖ The following courses received **Stand Alone** approval on Jan. 21st: APEL 123A, 125A, APPR 159, 168, APPT 129, 135A, 135B, 137A, 137B, 153, APRT 141B, 155A, 155B, ESLL 250, GIST 90A, 90B, 90C, 101A, 101B, 101C, 101D, JRYM 100, 105, 107, MDIA 30, 31, 51, 52, SPAN 51.
- ❖ **Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT):** The following ADT applications received FHDA Board approval at their January 13th meeting: Art History (AA-T), Business Administration (AS-T) and Kinesiology (AA-T). They will be submitted to the State Chancellor's Office asap.
- ❖ **ADT Progress:** We are required to have 20 ADTs State approved by June 30th. Here's our score so far: 6 State approved, 5 submitted (pending), 3 ready to be submitted and 5 written and currently being edited. One problem: the Music TMC requires performance courses and we don't have any. We've asked if we may use some De Anza courses to fulfill that requirement. If we can't use them, we have been told the consequence of not having an approved ADT in any of the identified disciplines may mean that the State will not allow us to confer our locally approved degree. We are awaiting their decision.

- ❖ **Content Review & Stand Alone Forms:** Please remember that all supplemental documentation must be turned in to your division curriculum committees at the time you submit course outlines. Any delay will cause the outlines to stagnate in the approval process and possibly not get approved for the current cycle and the next Catalog.
