RE: Fall 2016 Non-F1/FZ Student Profile

As a follow up to the Fall 2016 Open Doors Report, A&R would like to better understand the non-F1/FZ student group. This memo summarizes their visa types, zip code areas and the number of sections they are enrolled in for the fall 2016 term. There is a total of 494 non-F1/FZ students.

Visa Type

• The majority of the students have an exchange student (16%), H visa dependent (14%) or temporary protected status visa (13%). Combined these 3 visa categories account for 43% of all non-F1/FZ students.

 - San Jose East 880, Alviso, Milpitas, Fremont, Union City, Newark, Hayward, East Palo Alto = 23%
 - San Mateo, Atherton, Redwood City, San Carlos, Foster City = 11%
